

# Pre-travel Veterinary Inspection Form for Racehorses Travelling to Hong Kong to compete in International Races

## A. PRE-TRAVEL VETERINARY INSPECTION AND MEDICATION DECLARATION INSTRUCTIONS -

- THE PRE-TRAVEL VETERINARY INSPECTION
  - 1.1. Every invited horse will be subject to a Pre-Travel Veterinary Inspection performed by a Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) appointed veterinary surgeon before its departure to Hong Kong, irrespective of the country in which the horse is located at the time. The purpose of this inspection is to ensure that the horse is not suffering from any obvious problems, which could:
    - adversely affect its health during travel
    - cause it to finish lame or "break down" during the race
    - have an adverse effect on its performance in the race
    - jeopardise its chances of competing in the race

The inspection will require the horse to be trotted-up in-hand on a firm, flat surface to assess its action and to have its locomotor structures palpated for abnormalities.

- 1.2. The horse must be able to race wearing <u>four nailed-on plain aluminium plates (shoes)</u>. If proven necessary and subject to prior approval by the Club's Department of Veterinary Regulation and International Liaison (DVR&IL), glued-on aluminium plates may be worn, however, it must be noted that such shoes will not be permitted to be applied, or re-applied, less than two (2) hours prior to the time a horse is due to start in a race.
- 1.3. This compulsory inspection <u>must</u> be performed between six (6) days (maximum) and three (3) days (minimum) prior to the horse departing for Hong Kong, irrespective of the country in which the horse is located at the time, and the report must be submitted on this standard form.
- 2. THE PRE-TRAVEL MEDICATION DECLARATION FORM TWO (MDF2)
  - 2.1. At the time of the inspection, the HKJC inspecting veterinary surgeon <u>must</u> obtain from the horse's Trainer, a completed and signed copy of the Medication Declaration Form Two for Racehorses Travelling to Hong Kong to Compete in International Races (MDF2), which records any additional medications administered to the horse <u>since</u> the first medication form (MDF1) was completed and submitted to the HKJC's DVR&IL.
  - 2.2. It is important that **all medications** administered to the horse are declared on the completed form submitted to the HKJC as required, **irrespective** of whether or not the medications are considered to be, or to contain, prohibited substances under the rules of racing of any other racing authority.

The inspecting veterinary surgeon is required by the Club to confirm that he/she was provided by the horse's Trainer with documentary evidence certifying that the equine influenza vaccinations have been carried out in accordance with the Race Conditions and the Hong Kong Government's Horse Information Document for the Temporary Importation or Transhipment or Re-Entry of Registered Horses into Hong Kong (Revised September 2011) which states:

No horse shall be accepted for travel to Hong Kong unless it is certified by a qualified registered veterinary surgeon to be correctly vaccinated against EQUINE INFLUENZA as follows -

During the 90 days immediately prior to export from its country of permanent or usual residency, but not within 14 days of export, the horse was administered:

## **EITHER**

A primary course of approved vaccinations against equine influenza comprising of at least 2 doses with an interval of 4 to 6 weeks.

## OR

A booster vaccination against equine influenza which was given within 12 months of a primary course, or within 12 months of a booster vaccination where it, and any other previous booster vaccinations, had been administered annually within a regular 12-month period since the primary course (which consisted of at least 2 doses with an interval of 4 to 6 weeks).

Certified documentary evidence of such vaccinations must be available for inspection by the HKJC and Government Officials.

- 4. Clinical signs of infectious diseases must also be noted and reported to both the local veterinary authorities and to the Hong Kong Jockey Club.
- 5. The HKJC inspecting veterinary surgeon must send both the updated Second Medication Declaration Form (MDF2) and this completed Pre-Travel Veterinary Inspection Form to the HKJC's DVR&IL at least three (3) days prior to the horse departing for Hong Kong.
